COVID-19 Update

Vaccinations – California Government officials have generated a COVID-19 vaccine plan to vaccinate most Californians in all 58 counties by summer 2021. For more information on the state's 3-Phase plan for vaccination distribution, please visit <u>California's COVID-19</u> Response Page.

New COVID-19 variants – New variants of COVID-19 have been identified. Researchers have found several forms including the South African, Brazilian, and now the Indian variant. These new strains are more contagious than the original strain and vaccination effectiveness is being evaluated. As of April 5, 2021:

- California has administered 19,894,885 total vaccinations
- San Mateo County has reported a total of 40,618 current cases of COVID-19

San Mateo County Health has been tracking COVID-19 data and has compiled the information into a Data Dashboard. The Dashboard is updated daily and reflects information collected from the previous day. To stay up to date with San Mateo's Health Data Dashboard, please visit the <u>County Data Dashboard</u>.

While San Mateo County, as well as other counties, have started the process of reopening, it is still recommended to wear a face covering, stay 6-feet apart from others, and limit group settings to your immediate households. Follow these San Mateo County Health guidelines to further protect yourself. Testing - Free testing is currently available in San Mateo as listed on the County of San Mateo website. For all other areas, you can perform a google search by using the key words "Free COVID testing [your city or county]." You may also reach out to your health care provider – just as you would with any other health concern. If you have been diagnosed with COVID-19, San Mateo County Health Department has provided a list of instructions to follow during your isolation period.
