DISTINCTIONS OF THE M.A. ED PROGRAM

- Candidates used action research as the foundation for their master's thesis, allowing the opportunity to investigate in depth a particular area of curriculum and instruction within their own classroom or school
- Credentialed teachers can transfer up to 6-units of graduate level coursework not applied to another degree
- Program graduates include master teachers, mentors, department chairs, school leaders, instructional designers, curriculum developers, educational consultants, managers in non-profit organizations, college and university faculty
